

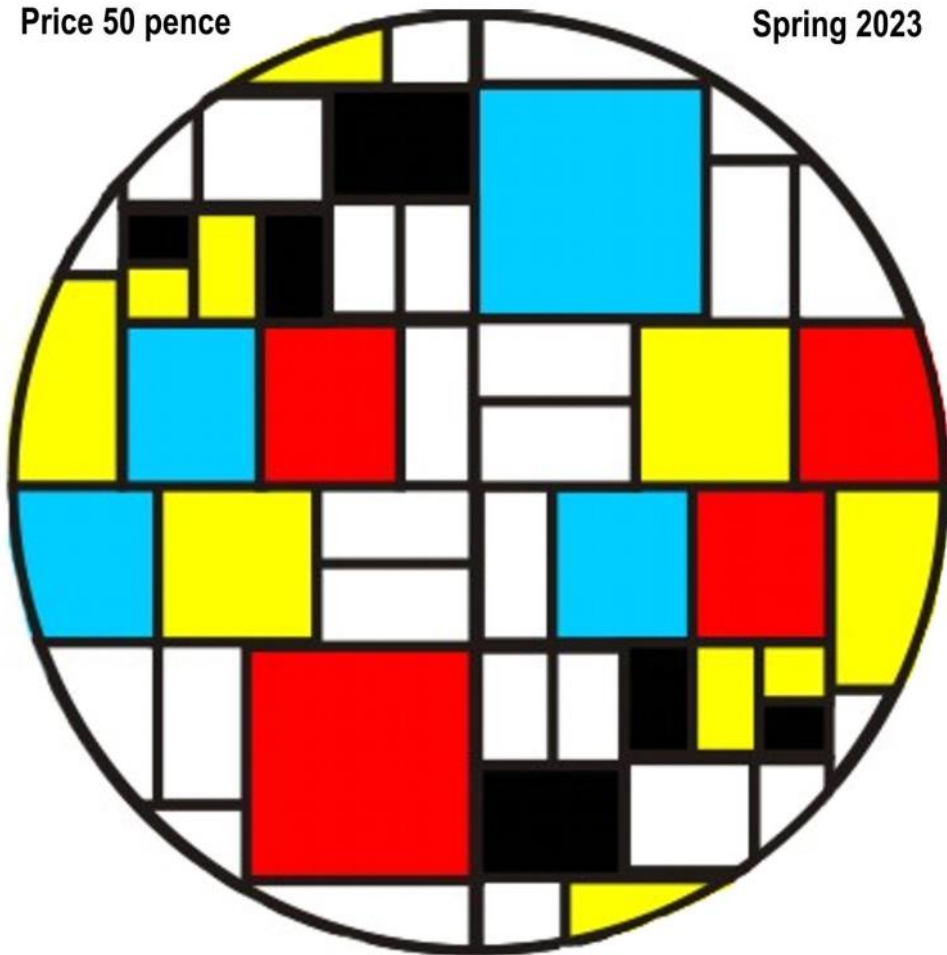

Dear Friends,

KEEP MOVING FORWARD ...

As I write, we have just come through the busyness and excitement of Christmas and the New Year celebrations and are now approaching the end of the season of Epiphany. Soon our liturgical calendar will begin counting down to Ash Wednesday and the six weeks of Lent which, in turn, lead us on to the great festival of Easter.

Annually, our calendars mark the passage of time through twelve months of the year and along the way we note various events, which are of importance either to us personally or to others, which occur on specific dates. So it is, also, with the liturgical calendar. It marks our passage through the Church's year from the beginning of Advent to the end of the long season of Sundays After Trinity, otherwise referred to as 'Ordinary Time'.

The passage of time can appear either rapid or slow, depending upon what is actually happening, and is always relentless. We cannot stop it, nor can we turn the clock back, much as we sometimes might wish to. As we journey through life we have no option but to keep moving forward into the future. If that thought scares you it's probably because we often fear the unknown and, much as we might plan ahead, the truth is that none of us can actually know what lies ahead.

The good news is that we worship a God who holds the future in His hands. He knows the end from the beginning. Just as He knows us, each of us individually, better than we know ourselves. Where to us the future is an undiscovered country to God it is already known and planned for. God gives us free will, to decide for ourselves the path we will take, but He offers us guidance, and more than that, His presence on the way. If we trust our way to Him, He will ensure that our future plays out exactly as He has determined, which is always for our good.

Praying that you know His presence with you in the coming months.

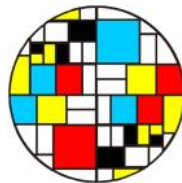

Vera May Kelly

31st October 1924 – 18th November 2022



Vera had a long and rich life shared with many people. She was born in Shoreditch and as a young woman during the Second World War, trained as a teacher. Her career started in Strood and progressed through several teaching posts until finally becoming deputy head at Sydenham Girls' School where she stayed until she retired in the 1980s. She lived in Chislehurst in the same house from the 1950s and the contents reflect her many interests.

She was an accomplished artist, making detailed botanical paintings; she enjoyed pottery; she worked in silver and had her own assay mark; she was a meticulous needlewoman, belonging to two local lace-making groups and enjoyed many years woodworking, making bird and animal ornaments. Her interest in wildlife and the environment led to active involvement in the RSPB, spending many years fundraising for them. She also supported many environmental groups and charities.

She found a spiritual home when she was introduced to Holy Trinity. Her faith was nurtured by the ministry of clergy and her involvement in home groups. She took a full part in church life, involving herself in church events such as Church Fairs, Harvest Suppers and, in church services, by reading lessons and leading intercessions. In her 90s she established the weekly Thursday Coffee Morning and even became Church Warden, a role which she took very seriously and carried out with typical efficiency.

Her final months were spent in Greenhill Care Home where there was real mutual caring, respect and love between her and the staff.

She will be missed by many who were influenced and inspired by her throughout her long and fruitful life.

- **May** - parents and our young people raised a glass to toast the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. This was following our AGM in Holy Trinity church rooms, and Vicar Roger was tasked with judging a celebratory cake competition – entries by parents/carers and leaders. Unfortunately, mine looked like a blob! but I was impressed by the Corgi Dog cake, and some wonderful fresh strawberry cakes. A lot of effort was made by all, and Roger declared them all winners!

- **July** - Holy Trinity Summer Fete - the first one in two years, courtesy of Covid (!). The Scout Group held table games which young people and adults alike had fun playing, while also reaching out to the local community, networking, and making new friends.
- **November** - the Church Parade for Remembrance Sunday was well attended.
- **December** - Church Toy Service Church Parade. The gifts our young people gave went to the charity 'CASPA' (Community Autistic Support, Pride and Advocacy).

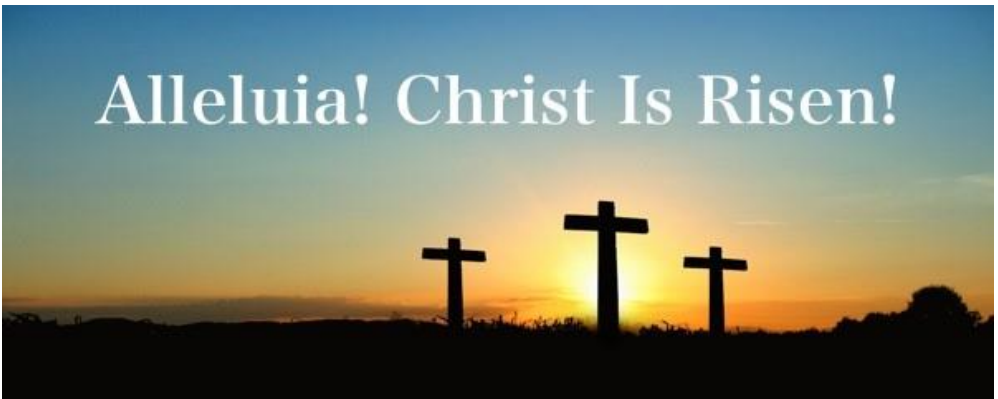

The recipe for this tea loaf comes from a book I was given as a young bride almost fifty years ago. It was produced by the ladies of Coupar Angus Abbey in Scotland, all 72 pages laboriously typed and somehow duplicated, and I have been baking the loaf ever since. Wonderfully easy, it often turns up on the cake stall at church fetes and sometimes at Coffee and Chat on Thursday morning.

The only changes I have made over the years are that I now use paper liners in the baking tin instead of greasing, and I usually divide the mix between two one-pound tins, with one loaf going into the freezer.

Braemar Brack

- ***1lb mixed dried fruit***
- ***8 fluid ounces strong tea***
- ***5oz dark brown sugar***
- ***1 large egg, beaten***
- ***11oz self-raising flour***

Place the dried fruit, sugar and tea in a bowl and leave to soak overnight. Next day, heat the oven to 160C (140C fan), gas mark 3. Add the beaten egg and flour to the bowl and stir until thoroughly combined.

Grease a two-pound loaf tin, or 2 one-pound tins (or use paper liners) before filling with the mixture. Bake for 1½ hours, or 1 hour for the smaller loaves, until a skewer comes out clean. Leave to cool, then slice thinly and spread with butter if required.

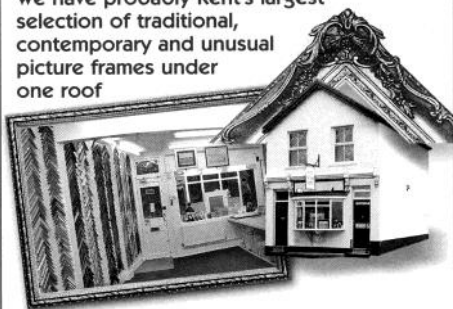
